Networking		<p>Anita Ollerenshaw: Rhubarb Farm https://rhubarbfarm.wixsite.com/rhubarbfarm Anita introduced Lee who came to RF as a volunteer and now works there as a support worker. Rhubarb Farm offers work placements, training and volunteering opportunities to people with long-term issues or people who want to learn about growing their own fruit and vegetables. They offer support to people who are ex-offenders, have mental ill health, physical ill health, learning disability, physical disability, dementia, are school students struggling with their behaviour at school, are recovering drug or alcohol misusers, or are ex-service personnel with PTSD. From Sept 2019 will be delivering Asdan training https://www.asdan.org.uk/training for pre 16s including functional maths and English. From Jan 2020 this will broaden out to be available to everyone. Also working with families in Bassetlaw to change mind-sets about food and help people to really understand where the food on their plate actually comes from.</p> <p>Langwith Show takes place on Saturday 7th September noon until 4pm and pitches are available for organisations to have a stand and run a game – the ask this year is for traditional village fete games like a coconut shy, can knock down etc. There are also traditional classes you can enter https://docs.wixstatic.com/ugd/d40585_Off07b45782d4774b96db42fdc8f7cff.pdf</p> <p>On Saturday mornings the farm is currently open to the public for fruit and veg sales – come and pick your own. Emergency food bags can also be available from RF when they have surplus produce.</p> <p>Mark Gavin and Karl Williams: Rapid response team Working to help Bassetlaw patients avoid hospital stays or to get home from hospital as soon as possible – help with exercises, occupational therapy, physio, access to gym equipment, links to social work team to enable care packages, working collaboratively with other health professionals.</p> <p>From Monday 29th July Call for Care pilot begins – if a patient falls and calls for an ambulance they will be medically triaged by 111 and rapid response will be alerted to go out and assess the patient to get them off the floor and make them safe then decide if an ambulance is needed. RR can respond to calls to get out within 30 minutes – so quicker than an ambulance.</p> <p>Tim Gladman: Bassetlaw District Council “What Next in North Notts” takes place at North Notts arena on 1st October 2019. A careers event for school years 11 – 13 to highlight the range of opportunities allowing young people to make informed decisions about their next steps into the world of work or ongoing education. An opportunity for meaningful conversations leading to meaningful decisions. Looking to grow partnerships and relationships with 3rd sector organisations.</p> <p>Fay Senior: Shared Lives A fostering service for adults over 18 years old. Based in the carer’s home – can be long term care, respite, hospital discharge, rural support. Fay will be a guest speaker at Octobers forum so will give a full overview of the service then.</p> <p>Maria Ward: D2N2 An ask for feedback when gaps in services are identified so that Maria can aim to influence decisions made across Nottinghamshire. Please sign up for the D2N2 bulletins here https://www.d2n2ta.org/</p> <p>Tracey Lack: iWork Nottinghamshire Working with learning disability and Asperger’s to support people into work and then to stay in work. Working in job centres and local libraries – can support appropriate residents with job applications.</p> <p>Karen Bonsall: Inspire Training The Autumn programme has now been scheduled and will be available shortly. It will include a study programme aimed at 16 – 24 year olds who are not yet ready for work. On Saturday 5th October Worksop library will be holding a family event “Fun Palace” http://funpalaces.co.uk/discover/worksop-library-fun-palace/ All of the library building will be opened up – including the Community Resource centre – and organisations are very welcome to attend and run an info stand and family health and wellbeing activity. Karen shared that she will shortly be moving on to a new role based around Sherwood Forest called from Miner to Major – a lottery funded project working with local communities. https://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/newsroom/news/lottery-windfall-for-sherwood-forest-project</p> <p>Sandra Young: YMCA Notts The YMCA opened a 23 bed supported accommodation centre on Bridge Street in Worksop around 6 weeks ago. https://www.nottsymca.com/housing/worksop/ There are also 2 transitional properties and plans for up to 6 more. The accommodation is available to single homeless residents aged 18 – 35 years. The supported accommodation comprises 7 flats of between 2 and 4 beds which are manned from 8am until 2am. It is not available to high risk/ high need residents but is available to drug / alcohol users as long as they are currently engaging with support (i.e. Change, Grow Live). There are currently beds available so appropriate referrals can be made. There will also be a YMCA shop once the work has been done to the street facing part of the building.</p> <p>Ben Eckersley: Bassetlaw ICP Part of a wider health strategy looking at integrated care and care in the round. Looking at the wider determinants of health, working collaboratively across the system on various work streams that include Estates, Digital and IT and Transport.</p> <p>Paul Gilbert: Nottinghamshire Mind Delivering low cost and effective psychotherapy and counselling – in Bassetlaw are based on Hardy Street, Worksop. Currently 1 – 2 months from contact to appt for long term support. 4new therapists have been recruited for Bassetlaw – with the aim being that each site has 20 therapists so services are more accessible.</p> <p>Julie Harper: DWP disability and employment advisor Coaching the work coaches around customers who are on the health journey through to employment. Julie made the point that when migrating from ESA onto UC – it does not necessarily mean that customers will need to be looking for work if their health circumstances are not supportive.</p>
