Carol Burkitt – APTCOO (A Place to Call Our Own) - <http://www.aptcoo.co.uk/> Now run an independent school for children who don't fit into mainstream or 'special' education schools. Also run Mon evening session at Stephen House in Retford.

Emma Walker –Aurora <http://www.aurorawellbeing.org.uk/worksop/> supporting long-term cancer diagnosis. 22nd May is Nutritional Day at Aurora. It's an event that is open to the general public and is part of the 'Be Cancer Safe' project- raising awareness of the signs and symptoms of cancer and letting people know what screening is available to them. Bassetlaw has more than average cancer diagnosis and people are less likely to check.

Vicky Waring – Home Instead Senior Care <https://www.facebook.com/homeinsteadretfordandgainsborough/> Vicky continues to provide much needed community services as part of her private sector business and it is always great to welcome her to the forum as she brings a different perspective to the group. The Singing group that takes place on a Thursday desperately needs help with transport - Lynn from BAC said to contact them as they may be able to help with this. The Bygones Tea Room monthly reminiscing group are still very active – first Monday of every month at Bassetlaw Museum in Retford. Each month they use a box of items from the museum to reminisce. A new 'Friendship Lunch' at The Ashley has just started on Mondays - £6 for a 2 course meal that includes entertainment. Vicky has some free family dementia training for those supporting somebody living with dementia.

Amy Pyott - Lasting Differences <http://www.lastingdifferences.co.uk/> Continue their work transforming lives and rebuilding futures through their peer mentor scheme, coaching, counselling & advocacy. Freedom 12 week programme.

Catherine Burn – BCVS <http://www.bcvs.org.uk/> Introduced Diane Heaver, new volunteer coordinator at BCVS, who comes from a previous role working with drug & alcohol recovery clients.

Clara Taylor – Royal Voluntary Service <https://www.royalvoluntaryservice.org.uk/get-help/services-search-results?q=worksop#results> 'Home from Hospital' scheme for people who are 50+- extra support for 6 weeks. RVS have secured funding from Tesco which will provide 300 welcome home hampers with the supplies needed for a return home after a stay in hospital. These will be available to nurses at Bassetlaw hospital and they will distribute to the people who they feel need it most. These first 300 will be distributed to anyone of any age.

James Entwisle - Inspire Building Better Opportunities project <https://www.inspireculture.org.uk/skills-learning/building-better-opportunities/> helping people towards employment. 2 different strands - one geared for learning disabilities, mental health and physical disabilities. Both strands are for long-term unemployed supporting their journey to personal progression and employment.

Tracy Lack I-Work NNC <http://www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/jobs-and-working/support-to-find-employment/employment-support-disability> Supporting people with Autism, Asperger's & Disabilities to obtain and remain in volunteering or employment positions. Covers all of Bassetlaw as one of small team – each assigned to a district within Notts.

Noelle Barron - Focus on Young People in Bassetlaw <https://www.foypib.org.uk/> This organisation gives small grants to young people & organisations to develop skills & give opportunities. The grants are usually between £100 and £500. Recently funded a young person to do gymnastics who had previously had issues with anti-social behaviour. The young person has now been able to move on and away from that social group. Application process on website. Funded by events throughout the year including Welbeck Fun Run on 13th May. 'Ambition' show in partnership with schools on 19th June.

Sophie Forbes-Taylor - Transform <http://www.transformtraining.org.uk/about-us.php> Working with young people with learning disabilities- mainly emotional resilience work. Transform run a drama group at BCVS on Tues evenings to build confidence. Looking

Thinks H&S forum has been beneficial as they have seen an increase in referrals. Part of NCHA. Emma Lovatt from Connect is now working on a new project with the with discharge team at NHS for people who have had a sudden illness or stroke</p>
