B-Friend Charlotte Schooley		<p>https://www.letsbfriend.org.uk/ Befriending Service and social groups Recently expanded from Doncaster into Rotherham, South Yorks and Bassetlaw. A free befriending service for over 65s with no time limitations or end date attached. Unable to accept dementia diagnosis patients or those with acute mental health needs. No waiting list, try to keep volunteers and matches local. People can just access the social/ activity groups or can use the befriender service as well or instead. Volunteer befrienders can be any age and the website shows a map where the volunteers are needed so people know that it can be someone in their local community that they will be matched with. Volunteers are asked to commit to just one hour a week and will receive training as well as access to a counselling service. Referrals into service can be done by self, family, support worker etc.</p>

Can help with boiler repairs, energy workshops, energy switching, home insulation, front line staff training. Working to improve confidence levels in the most at risk people whose lives have been impacted by substance abuse. Supporting through Coaching, Counselling and Advocacy. - Emma Lovatt - Connect. https://careandsupport.ncha.org.uk/bassetlaw-connect Working on the hospital discharge programme supporting patients to successfully return and stay at home following a hospital admission. Look to ensure patients are claiming all the benefits they are entitled to and refer into the Social Prescribing scheme where relevant - Siobhan Drake – Transform Training. http://www.transformtraining.org.uk/ Breakaway Project Coordinator - Specialise in emotion education for vulnerable young people, helping them to understand their feelings better and to manage and cope with them in everyday life through creative arts projects. Young people with learning disabilities age 14 – 25. Worksop group is closing and moving to Mansfield in a bid to increase attendee numbers. Currently looking for a volunteer driver. - Anita Ollerenshaw – Rhubarb Farm. https://rhubarbfarm.wixsite.com/rhubarbfarm A project supporting age 11 and upwards with multiple and complex needs. Everyone is referred to as a volunteer and referrals are taken from schools, mental health teams, DWP, self –referrals. Rhubarb Farm is a horticultural based social enterprise. There is a community café on site as well as a charity shop. RF have just won a chunk of funding from ITV peoples project to run a community gardening service that will be available Bassetlaw wide. and have also recently been donated a minibus which picks up daily at 9.15am at Worksop Asda on memorial Avenue to go to Rhubarb Farm. <p>Work with dementia support to run Singing for the Brain sessions, can run team building days and always welcome visits. From Sept will run Asdan training – maths, English, employability skills and life skills – in response to a request from schools. Also in Sept starting a grow and learn course. These have been running successfully by Caledonian RHS in Scotland and this will be the first course run in England. It’s a course based on personal goals and progress.</p> <p>Rhubarb Farm will once again be hosting Langwith show on 7th September and will also be at Chatsworth RHS Flower Show. The Red Barrows display team are on tour throughout the summer so watch out for them!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tim Gladman – Skills Officer at Bassetlaw District Council.
