

Lord, bring them comfort, strength and renewed hope.


Inspire us to unite in solidarity, acting swiftly and generously, so that help may reach all who need it.




The origins of World Day of Prayer date back to the 19th century when Christian women

## From Fr Spicer . . . . . .

During Lent, at our worship, we only have music to support our singing. We have no flowers and a lot more quiet times. This is to simplify things and help us to focus on the presence of the Holy Spirit with us during this season of penitence and reflection. This leads to a deepening and growth in our Christian discipleship.

The quiet times especially aren't always easy, so please do prepare yourself before you leave home, asking that same Holy Spirit to calm your busy mind and life. When you arrive at church some people will already be there, so please save you conversations until Mass finishes. A smile, nod of the head, quiet hello, is good to be welcoming and being welcomed. Before Mass think of when you were last at Mass, or confession and what you need to say sorry for. Is there a situation or person that you want to make as your intention?

Reading through the Scripture readings or one of the hymns will help you focus and prepare to meet with the forgiving, merciful Lord. After the homily, be still and try to hear what the words are saying to you.

On the way to make your Holy Communion think of that intention you made and how the Lord is coming into the situation, or person as you receive Him in Holy Communion. Having received Holy Communion be thankful for being fed, loved and nourished.

After Mass the temptation is to rush away, catch up with someone, but please be still and quiet especially if there are still folks around you kneeling, or sitting. Maybe light a candle as a sign to God and others of your prayer.

We still have refreshments after Mass, Lent isn't that bad! So, over refreshments, please chat away with your brothers and sister with whom who you have worshipped, before leaving in peace to "glorify God with your life".

Thank you for playing your part in enabling yourself and others to have times of praise and worship at the beginning of a new week.


