# **DUWC CELEBRATES ITS 40TH ANIVERSARY**

On June 28th Derbyshire Unemployed Workers' Centres (DUWC), along with the Derbyshire Law Centre, Links CVS, and DAST (Derbyshire Asbestos Support Team) threw its doors open for an open day to formally mark the 40th anniversary of the Centres.

Since 1983, we've been supporting local people and we are proud to still be fighting for your voices, 40 years down the line. The first centre was established in Chesterfield in 1983, after work carried out by trade unionists in the area, and a Portakabin on the doughnut roundabout was the first building occupied by the group, who quickly established themselves as the first independent advice centre in the town. A fine reputation was soon gained by Gordon Smith, Marian Brooks, and Doug Herring, who helped support the many people put out of work by the policies pursued in the 1980s, and the subsequent pit closure programme. Colin Hampton was appointed Coordinator in January 1985 and remains in post today.

Since 1983, much has changed, but DUWC's core mission of supporting local people and fighting for their voices to be heard remains the same. Now, arguably more than ever, our service is relied upon by thousands of people from Chesterfield, Bolsover, North-East Derbyshire, and Amber Valley.







### **DUWC COORDINATOR COLIN HAMPTON:**

"THE PEOPLE WHO SET UP THIS ORGANISATION IN THE EARLY 1980S NEVER ENVISAGED THAT IT WOULD STILL BE NEEDED FORTY YEARS LATER. ALTHOUGH THE PROBLEMS ARE DIFFERENT TODAY, OUR OFFICES ARE STILL FULL OF PEOPLE NEEDING HELP AND ADVICE TO NAVIGATE THE COMPLEX BENEFITS SYSTEM, AND MAXIMISE THEIR INCOMES THROUGH THESE DIFFICULT TIMES.

# **DUWC CELEBRATES ITS 40TH ANIVERSARY**

The open day was a huge success, attended by staff, volunteers, trustees and local supporters, including a number of councillors and key decision makers from across the region.

Visitors could speak with current advisors to learn more about the welfare rights advice we provide, and browse our exhibitions to see 40 years of history in action.

At 3pm, Assistant General Secretary of the TUC Katye Bell unveiled our mural, charting DUWC's incredible history. The mural will now be on permanent display in the Chesterfield office for anyone to see. We also have a number of smaller versions of the mural, which will be sent out to DUWC outreaches so that everyone across the area can appreciate the wonderful history of the organisation.

After the open day had concluded, Kate Bell delivered the annual John Knight Memorial Lecture in the Chesterfield Town Hall. Kate spoke about the work she does at the TUC and how TUC campaigns can be strengthened by working with community based organisations such as TRUST and the DUWC. Following the lecture, Kate handed out the John Knight Memorial Award of £1,000 to Chesterfield and North Derbyshire Stand Up to Racism group who have done so much to support refugees and fight racism over the past twelve months.



# SUPPORT FOR FORMER MINEWORKERS AND THEIR FAMILIES

As previously reported, DUWC has been awarded a grant of nearly £40,000 by CISWO—the Coal Mining Charity— to enable us to support former mineworkers and their families across Derbyshire and maximize their incomes during the ongoing cost of living crisis. We are focusing particularly on Attendance Allowance - a non-means tested benefit which many former mineworkers would qualify for.

We have already made good inroads with former mineworkers, and are keen to ensure that we reach as many affected people as possible, so please share this information with anyone you feel may qualify. # HOLIDAY HUNGER CAMPAIGN

As the Summer holidays approach, and the cost of living crisis shows no signs of abating, the issue of Holiday Hunger is once again on the agenda for many families.

Though some children from low-income families can access free school meals during term time, there is not an equivalent widespread service available in the holiday period. The real-term value of benefits is 6% lower than before the pandemic, and wages have stagnated, all while the inflation rate for food and drink has rocketed to 18.3%, making even the essentials a challenge for thousands across Derbyshire.

Without the guarantee of one cooked meal a day, children across the country face a summer of struggle and malnutrition. Holiday Hunger has knock-on effects for families, such as social isolation, as they are unable to enjoy the time off together and do family activities like others. Low-income children will come back to school at a disadvantage to their peers, as evidence shows they will have difficulty concentrating and following lessons.

DUWC will be taking this issue up over the Summer period, campaigning for better provision for low-income families. Unfortunately, this is not the first time we have campaigned on this issue, but we will continue to stand up for vulnerable families in the region.


We will then be able to send out further information on our plans for the day.
