Bassetlaw Community Grants Case Study: Bassetlaw Foodbank - Grow it Fix it



This project is an allotment, orchard and white goods repair project for local people.

The main aims of Grow it Fix it are to create volunteering opportunities for Manton residents, provide food and household goods to those in need in Bassetlaw and to provide learning opportunities regarding 'where food comes from'.

Key outcomes & outputs

150 attended the 2nd family fun day in August
The produce grown has been used in lunch club meals (honey roasted cabbage and beetroot), sent out to individuals and families in food parcels, and sold in the Bassetlaw Community Shop

Because of the project
The funding has provided the consistency of a Project Manager which has allowed us to fully invest in the project and its success. We have experimented, learnt a lot (and continue to do so) and interacted with residents in a way that we previously could not.

Key outcomes

82 local people supported

6 volunteers recruited

Before the funding

There was no community activities taking place on a regular basis and no volunteers to help run this type of activity.

Because of the funding

We now have a paid Community Organiser who has built a team of volunteers who help run a Coffee Morning on Monday's, a Warm Welcome session on Tuesday's and a Toddler Group on Thursday's.

The volunteers have completed the necessary safeguarding training and where required have been DBS cleared.

Bolsover Community Grants Case Study: Freedom Community Project - Job Club



Participant case study

My husband passed away recently, before which, I was his carer. This was a 24/7 job. Since his passing, my friends & family have told me to try and enjoy my life now and do things that make me happy, however, I only had baking as a hobby. I wanted to connect with a new group of people, whether that was a part-time job, volunteering or meeting up for a coffee. I feared my loneliness would get the better of me.

Because of the project

When I was signposted to the Job Club, I was worried that I would get turned away but was pleasantly surprised. Lyndsey listened, was empathetic and compassionate. She asked questions to better understand my situation and helped me fill out forms. I was nervous at first as my mental health is poor and I was worried about committing. She explained that we could try attending the free cafes where I could meet people. I did this a few times until ready to move further. We then look at volunteering - she gave me Freedom's volunteer briefs and we went online and looked at other opportunities on the BCVS website. Lyndsey remembered from our first session that I loved baking, and suggested being a volunteer baker for Freedom. I was immediately excited at the idea and asked how to proceed. She helped me fill out the application form and I gathered references. Within the week I was approved. I now deliver my baking to the 2 separate free cafes and stop for a drink and a chat with the regulars when I do. **I feel that I have got a purpose now and that I am thriving!**

Key outcomes & outputs

42 supported to access basic skills

40 supported to engage in life skills

27 supported to participate in education

Freedom Community Project Job Club

Bassetlaw Community Grants Case Study: Bassetlaw Futsal Foundations



This project will bring together young people from across the district to engage in futsal. It will support people by promoting physical activity, volunteerism, and community leadership in areas of high deprivation. Four events will be delivered, providing volunteer opportunities for adults and young

leaders. This will result in the creation of both one-off and regular volunteer positions, contributing to local capacity building.

The project will strengthen community cohesion by bringing together diverse groups and encouraging collaboration. By working closely with local community organisations and sports clubs, we will foster long-term partnerships to ensure sustainability.

It will significantly enhance pride in place by transforming Harworth and Bircotes into a vibrant hub for futsal.

Key outcomes & outputs

4 events

39 volunteers engaged

26 junior football sides introduced to Futsal

- Engagement across Bassetlaw with teams playing from Worksop, Retford, Harworth and wider district
- Excellent relationship formed with SJR Worksop in particular, leading to further opportunities for sustainability
- Raising profile of Bassetlaw

Because of the project

The project has had a transformative impact on the local community. The events fostered community pride and unity while showcasing Harworth and Bircotes as a vibrant hub for futsal. Partnerships with local organisations have opened doors for sustainable opportunities and further development. Additionally, the project has elevated Bassetlaw's profile as a futsal hub, sparking discussions with the Football Foundation and the local FA about facility demands and leading to the establishment of an SHFA-affiliated futsal club in the district.

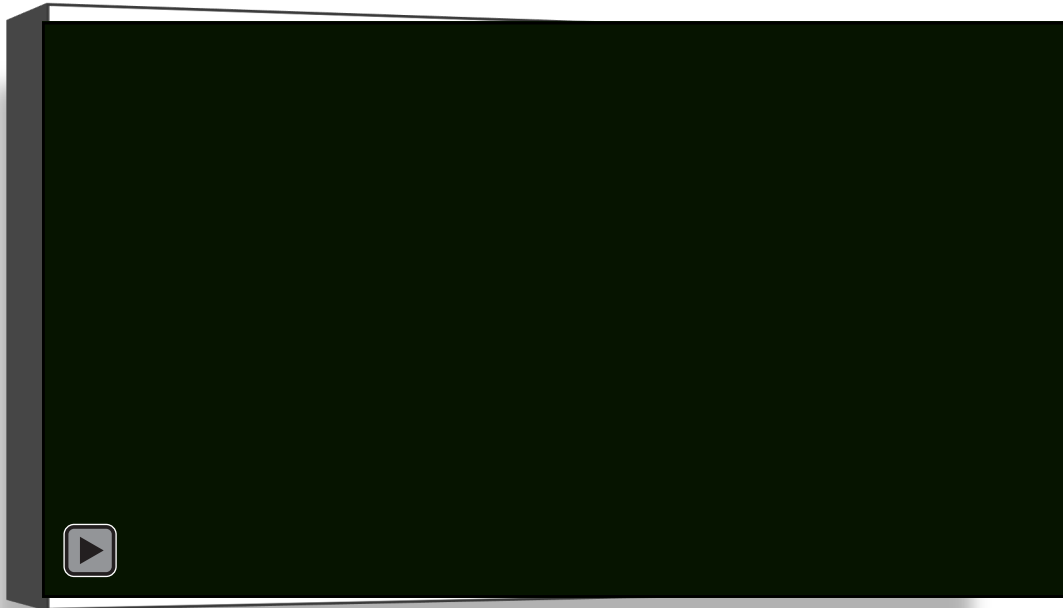
