



Stakeholder update: Bassetlaw voluntary sector funding

You will be aware that we recently carried out a listening exercise with people who use voluntary sector organisations in Bassetlaw, their staff and wider stakeholders. You can read the report from this listening exercise.

We are pleased to confirm that the ICB will continue to fund the following nine organisations until 31 March 2026.

- Bassetlaw Action Centre
- Bassetlaw Community Voluntary Service
- Barnsley Premier Leisure
- · Citizens Advice North Nottinghamshire
- Royal Voluntary Service
- Children's Bereavement Service
- In Sam's Name
- Muddy Fork
- The Sleep Charity

After then, this programme of funding will end and will be replaced by a new funding model.

New funding model

For 2026/27, the ICB has committed to allocate to Bassetlaw voluntary sector organisations the same amount of money as in 2025/26 but only for services which address the population health needs of people in line with our Integrated Care Strategy. This does mean that for the next financial year there will be some grants that will reduce or be removed and others that will grow or be newly introduced.

We will work with Bassetlaw Place Based Partnership to co-produce a model to allocate the money to those organisations who demonstrate they can deliver outcomes aligned to the Integrated Care Strategy and NHS Joint Forward Plan. The ICB Place Team will provide oversight and assurance to ensure alignment with strategic priorities and objectives.

This co-produced model and proposed funding allocation will be shared with our Strategic Planning and Integration Committee in January for decision-making, with the funding to start in April 2026. Join us to celebrate National Eye Health Week!



Formerly called Dementia Connect

We offer support to anyone affected by dementia

Support offered by phone or home visit:

- Emotional
- Practical including health, social, legal and financial
- Representation in case conferences, MDT, discharge
- Symptom management
- +
- Cognitive stimulation therapy (CST)
- Carer information sessions virtual only





Referrals:

- Professional
- Self
- Personal
- Anonymous

Only professional referrals bypass the National Support Line.
Consent must be obtained.

Seven dementia advisers cover the Nottinghamshire area

Three Community Development Coordinators, 1 in city and 2 in county

Community development coordinators responsibilities:

- Reduce stigma by raising awareness and key dementia messaging
- Dementia prevention healthy lifestyle promotion
- Identify barriers faced by under represented groups and ways to remove them
- Improve early diagnosis rates

- Identify gaps in dementia provision in the county and develop sustainable ways to fill them.

- Helping design services and specific dementia offers

- Connect people with support
